Task description:

The Report is to be written on the internal evaluation of the Tourism study programme at the Business and Technical College of Applied Sciences in Užice in the 2014/15 academic year done by students and the evaluation of the college by college staff. This report is based on the Internal Evaluation Report prepared by the BTC Internal Evaluation Commission for the 2014/15 academic year.

Description of outcomes:

The report on the appraisal of the Tourism study programme (undergraduate and specialist studies) in the 2014/15 academic year.

INTRODUCTION

The Report on the Internal Evaluation of the Tourism study programme at the Business and Technical College of Applied Sciences in Užice in the 2004/15 academic year was prepared by the BTC Užice Internal Evaluation Commission whose members were: Milovan Milivojević, MSc, President, and Damnjan Radosavljević, PhD, Zorica Sagić, PhD, Dragiša Mićić, MSc, and Đorđe Forst, Professional IT Specialist. Their report served as the basis for this report.

The report consists of two parts. The first part is about the evaluation of the college as a whole and of the Tourism study programme, and the second one is about the appraisal of the pedagogical work of the teaching staff at the Business and Technical College of Applied Sciences in Užice.

1. INTERNAL EVALUATION OF COLLEGE AND TOURISM STUDY PROGRAMME

In compliance with the quality assurance strategy of the Business and Technical College of Applied Sciences in Užice, and the internal evaluation of the college as a whole, as well as in compliance with the tendency for the improvement of the quality of study programmes and teachers and associates' work, at the end of the summer semester, the students in all years of all study programmes were surveyed.

The survey comprised two parts:

- Students' evaluation of the pedagogical work of college teachers
- Students' evaluation of the quality of study programmes and the college as a whole

The survey on the evaluation of the pedagogical work of teachers was carried out in the electronic form, anonymously.

Table 1 shows the total number of surveyed students, and the number of surveyed students per study programme of the college.

CONCLUSION

According to the survey results, it can be said that most students are satisfied or partly satisfied with the study programme they are enrolled in, as well as with the curriculum.

Most students are satisfied with the working conditions at the college (laboratories, IT classrooms, library, etc.). They made some very useful suggestions regarding the improvement of the practical activities at the college.

As to the library, most of the surveyed students are satisfied with the work of the library and think that it is well-equipped.

The surveyed students of all study programmes evaluated the college website with the average grade 4.20, with the comments and remarks about it as stated above.

In the period to come, the college will be working on the development of the mechanisms for regular and continual monitoring, control and evaluation of the work of heads of different departments, and non-teaching staff, paying special attention to the monitoring and evaluation of their relationship with students, and their motivation to work with students.

The work quality of non-teaching staff is controlled by the secretary and heads of service. The rules regarding the quality assurance methods, as well as the disciplinary measures, are defined in the Rules of Procedure and Work Agreements.

The results of the latest survey show that students are mostly partly satisfied with the work of the student service department. This department will have to improve in the future as it plays a very important role in building the image of the college.

2. REPORT ON APPRAISAL OF PEDAGOGICAL WORK OF TEACHING STAFF AT BTC UŽICE

The evaluation of the pedagogical work of teachers implies answering the following questions:

- Q1: The teacher presents coherently and comprehensibly
- Q2: The teacher is well-prepared for each class
- Q3: The teacher follows the agreed timetable
- Q4: The teacher motivates students and encourages them to reach a higher level of knowledge
- Q5: The teacher is objective when assessing students (Pre-exam tests / Seminar papers / Exams)
- Q6: The overall impression of the teacher
- Q7: How much time a week do you spend on average studying this subject outside the classroom)? (... h ... min)

Comment/Suggestion (this filed is not mandatory)

The total average grade of teachers for the 2014/15 academic year was 4.28, which was an insignificantly better result than that for the previous year, and the same as in the 2012/13 academic year.

The number of teachers who received the average grade higher than 4.00 for the 2014/15 academic year is 42 out of the total number of 52 teachers employed with this college, which represents the improvement in comparison with 38 out of 56 teachers as recorded for the 2013/14 academic year.

Conclusion and suggestions made by Internal Evaluation Commission regarding pedagogical work of teachers

- Generally speaking, the grades that teachers received from students regarding their pedagogical work are highly satisfactory (4.28). 42 teachers out of 52 received a grade higher than 4.
- The instruction is to be further improved, and a modern and reliable knowledge transfer system should be developed.
- As to the future surveys, the data collection techniques and methods should be further improved, and data should be analyzed using scientific methods.
