The report on the accomplished training of teachers and teaching associates should be written on the following topic: 'Training of teachers in ICT skills'.

The description of the outcome:

This report is the result of the joint work of the project team whose members are the representatives of the BTC Užice.

INTRODUCTION

This report on the WP3 *Training of teachers in distance learning*, i.e. Actiity 3.2. *ICT skills training* was prepared by the working team consisting of: Slobodan Petrović, MSc and Milutin Đuričić, PhD.

Besides the Introduction, the report includes the Description of training and workshops, Conclusions and Enclosures.

DESRIPTION OF TRAINING AND WORKSHOPS

Pursuant to the conversation with both the teaching and non-teaching stuff members of the Business and Technical College of Applied Sciences Užice, and the assessment of the current level of their ICT skills, as well as in compliance with the goals of the project and the necessity to improve the ICT skills of the BTC employees relating to distance learning, the project team of the Tempus project 544543 'Modernisation and Harmonisation of Tourism Study Programmes in Serbia', 544543-TEMPUS-1-2013-1-RS-TEMPUS-JPCR, organized three trainings as follows:

- 1) Monday, 22nd June 2015 at the Faculty of Hotel Management and Tourism, Vrnjačka Banja, Marijan Milošević, MSc, employed at the Faculty of Technical Sciences Čačak, University of Kragujevac, gave a lecture on the following topic: *Introduction to distance learning with an emphasis on the Moodle software package* (Enclosure 1). During the lecture, he explained the main principles of distance learning, its impacts on teaching, as well as the relevant experiences of other countries in using distance learning. The most commonly used distance learning system Moodle was presented as an example of distance learning. The training was aimed at preparing teachers for this new form of teaching, and determining their need for the development of new ICT skills. The training was attended by 15 BTC employees: 12 teachers (5 women), and 3 non-teaching staff members (3 women). (Enclosure 2)
- 2) Tuesday, 23rd June 2015 at the Faculty of Hotel Management and Tourism, Vrnjačka Banja, Docent Danko Milašinović, PhD, employed at the Faculty of Hotel Management and Tourism, University of Kragujevac, gave a lecture on the following topic: 'Office software for new generation in contemporary business and education' (Enclosure 1), with an emphasis on the use of Google services and tools (Google Drive, Google Docs). The acquired skills would ensure a higher quality and faster distance communication between teachers and students. The training was attended by 15 BTC employees: 12 teachers (5 women), and 3 non-teaching staff members (3 women). (Enclosure 2)
- 3) Friday, 4th September 2015 at the Business College of Applied Sciences, Leskovac, Professor Damnjan Radosavljević, PhD, employed at the Business and Technical College of Applied Sciences Užice and a member of the National Council of Higher Education of the Republic of Serbia, gave a lecture on the following topic: *Using modern technologies in higher education distance learning* (Enclosure 3). The training was focused on the presentation of the regulations of the Republic of Serbia governing the field of distance learning in higher education, as well as on the accredited distance learning study programmes

- which serve as the examples of the implementation of the legal regulations. The lecture contributed to the continuation of the already started activities regarding the organization of distance learning trainings at the BTC Užice. The training was attended by 7 BTC employees: 6 teachers (1 woman) and 1 non-teaching staff member. (Enclosure 4)
- 4) 8th 9th December 2015 at the Faculty of Engineering and Science, Chatham UK, University of Greenwich at Medway, Professor Milan Antonijević, PhD explained how the DLS Moodle is used at the University of Greenwich at Medway (Enclosure 5), as well as the possibilities and benefits of using this DL system. Special emphasis was placed on practical examples and instructions as to how teachers and students should use the Moodle system (e.g. how to monitor a student's activity, how to test students, advice about how to prepare teaching materials in the electronic form, etc.). The training was attended by 2 tecahers (1 woman).

CONCLUSION

The accomplishment of the abovementioned trainings raised the level of ICT skills of BTC employees regarding distance learning to the level necessary for the successful achievement of the next goal of the WP 3 *Training of teachers in distance learning*: completely independent work of a teacher in the Moodle DL system, and its application in the teaching process.


