# REPORT ON WORK VISIT TO UNIVERSITY OF GREENWICH AT MEDWAY, FACULTY OF ENGINEERING AND SCIENCE, CHATHAM 19-26 APRIL 2015

Visit to University of Greenwich, Faculty of Engineering and Science, Chatham, United Kingdom - organized within the Tempus project No. 544543-TEMPUS-1-2013-1-RS-TEMPUS-JPCR entitled "Modernization and Harmonization of Tourism Study Programs in Serbia" - took place from 19<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> of April, 2015, and comprised two activities: activity DEV 3.4 - *Subject related training* and activity MNGT 9.2 - *Regular meetings of Steering Committee*. Therefore, a total of 21 academic and non-academic partner institutions' representatives and staff members travelled to Chatham (see Appendix 1).

As the Agenda shows, the visit was divided in three parts:

- 1. Steering Committee Meeting,
- 2. Training course for teachers and teaching associates from Serbian partner HEIs, and
- 3. Tourism in practice.

## 1. STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING

The Steering Committee meeting was held at the premises of the Faculty of Engineering and Science in Chatham. Numerous themes related to the Project implementation in practice were discussed at the meeting that lasted for three days.

# FIRST DAY – Monday, 20th April 2015

Milan Antonijevic, PhD, UoG's contact person, greeted the meeting attendees and wished them a successful work and pleasant stay in Great Britain.

Prof. Milutin Djuricic, PhD, Coordinator of the MHTSPS project, thanked for the welcome statement on behalf of the participants, and greeted participants himself. He emphasized the importance of the forthcoming critical activities such as Intermediate report design (activity QPLN 6.2), equipment procurement (DEV 3.5), Project Conference (DISS 7.3), accreditation of modernized and developed study





programs (EXP 8.1), organization of workshops for tourism employees (WP 4) and training courses for teachers (WP 3).

Prof. Djuricic pointed that partial Intermediate reports, for each individual institution participating in the project, should be submitted to Coordinator no later than 8<sup>th</sup> of May, 2015. Paper form of financial documents should be submitted with report as well.

Prof. Djuricic informed the meeting attendees that the procedure for selecting the Auditing company is already launched. This company will perform the audit of the project in coordinating institution's premises. However, should the auditing firm wanted to visit some partner, the partner concerned will bear the corresponding expenses.

The importance of the activity DEV 3.5 – Equipment acquisition has also been emphasized. Meeting participants have been introduced with acquisition procedure and all the related problems.

Accreditation of modernized and harmonized study programs has been summarized. It was stated that BTC Uzice accredited one undergraduate and one postgraduate study program, HBS Leskovac two undergraduate study programs and one postgraduate study program, while FHMT from Vrnjacka Banja entered the procedure for accreditation of one undergraduate study program.

Prof. Djuricic said that ongoing activities should be intensified in order to gain enough space for raising the quality of the project implementation in future. Each activity must be documented and followed by the corresponding quality records. It was emphasized that the contact persons are aware of this.

Due attention was paid to the organization of workshops and courses for tourism employees. It has been agreed that two workshops – one for development of Logical Framework Matrix and one for defining the budget of a project – will be organized by the Consortium members. All the member institutions of the Consortium should be involved in creating the workshops' program. It has also been agreed that the workshops will take place in second half of June 2015 (from 21st to 26th of June) in Vrnacka Banja (June 21-24, 2015) and Novi Sad (June 25-26, 2015). The provisional agenda for both workshops has been proposed and adopted.

At the end of his speech, prof. Djuricic called the academic partners from Leskovac and Vrnjacka Banja to make arrangement with colleagues from TEIP and USAMV regarding the terms and content of the monitoring visits.

In the second part of the first day's meeting, prof. Milan Antonijevic, PhD, kept the presentation about Higher Education Quality Assurance and Control.

The members of Steering Committee unanimously issued a Decision on adoption of amendment to the Project Quality Management Plan for MHTSPS TEMPUS project and the second of the Project Quality Management Plan of the TEMPUS project number 544543-TEMPUS-1-2013-1-RS-TEMPUS-JPCR, entitled: "Modernization and Harmonization of Tourism study programs in Serbia" (*Work package 6, Activity 6.1*) has been adopted. This changes is a result of the Miloš Jovanović's resigned of the Steering Committee member duty, but he will stay as a contact person. Instead of Miloš Jovanović, the name of Nada Nedović will stand.

SECOND DAY – Wednesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2015

Professor Milutin Djuricic introduced the form of Intermediate report to the attendees. He briefly explained the content of the Report. Each part of the Report has been commented and discussed. ## SECOND DAY – Wednesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2015

Professor Milutin Djuricic introduced the form of Intermediate report to the attendees. He briefly explained the content of the Report. Each part of the Report has been commented and discussed. It has been agreed that the part of the Report related to equipment will be fulfilled by the Coordinator. Prof. Antonijevic commented that, in *Other comments* part, should be quoted what was the project's influence to the institution concerned in other areas (beside tourism) and what is the level of quality of the partnership and how can it contribute to implementation of some future projects.

Prof. Antonijevic then presented the second part of the Report to the attendees – Statistics and Indicators.

At the end, Prof. Djuricic emphasized once again that partial Intermediate reports, for each individual institution participating in the project, should be submitted to Coordinator no later than 8<sup>th</sup> of May, 2015, and that the three paper copies of supporting documentation should be submitted with report as well.

## THIRD DAY – Thursday, 23<sup>rd</sup> April, 2015

In the opening minutes of the third day's meeting, Prof. Djuricic talked about the forthcoming project activities. The importance of the accreditation of study programs has been emphasized once again.

After that, prof. Djuricic concluded that prof. Marija Mandaric, Dragan Stojanovic, Milos Jovanovic and Milutin Djuricic are responsible for the quality of a textbooks review.

Prof. Djuricic then talked about training courses for teachers (pedagogical training to be held in Vrnjacka Banja from 22-24 June 2015, subject related training held in London, English language training and IT training) and tourism employees. He stated that 1/3 of envisaged number of tourism employees have already been trained, and that the plan is to design at least 11 training courses until the end of the project implementation period. The program of these training courses will be designed according to the previously determined needs and market research results. Furthermore, prof. Djuricic informed the meeting participants about activities related to organization of 2<sup>nd</sup> International Conference, whose aim is to disseminate the results of the project. All the partners have been asked to submit the scientific papers and to provide student's papers as well. The objective of this year's Conference is to achieve the M10 status, so all the partners must prepare a high quality papers. Prof. Antonijevic commented that each generation of enrolled students should prepare a poster session at the end of the school year in order to attract the future students.




At the end, the participants discussed about Monitoring visits of TEMPUS office representatives and about provisional dates of EU partners' monitoring visits and Consortium meetings in Romania and Greece.

In general, during the three-day Steering Committee meeting, the participants were provided with very useful information regarding the ongoing and future project activities, such as design of Intermediate report, equipment procurement, Project Conference, accreditation of modernized and developed study programs, organization of workshops for tourism employees, training courses for teachers, audit, monitoring visits of EU partners and Tempus Office representatives, and others. The tasks were assigned to each partner institution and the future actions have been agreed.

## 2. TRAINING COURSE

Training course for Serbian academic partners' staff has also been held at the premises of University of Greenwich. It was constituted from the lectures regarding Quality Assurance and Quality Control in Higher Education, contemporary teaching methods, methodology and practical preparation of contemporary teaching material, as well as practical examples of education process implementation in practice. The lecturer was professor Milan Antonijevic, PhD.

Professor Antonijevic held a lecture on teaching methods used at the University of Greenwich at Medway, Faculty of Engineering and Science, Chatham, and provided several examples of teaching practice. It has been pointed out that the system for quality assurance at the University implies regular and systematic tracking of the teaching process implementation and taking measures for quality enhacement of curricula, teaching process, teaching staff, grading system, text books and literature. Such procedure meets well-defined standards and ensures the quality of academic study programs. Professor Antonijević presented a set of documents that portray demands, principles and practice applied during the process of design, development and implemention of study programs.

Regarding the control and inner quality assurance, it has been pointed out that study programs, composed of obligatory and elective courses, have got to be recognizable in the world, and subjects' curricula has to be authorized. All programs and subjects need to be formally approved, systematically monitored and periodically revised.



At University level, Committee for Teaching and Quality controls the assurance and enhancement of quality in the whole of University, while Academic Committee is in charge of activities related to cooperation. Activities of Central Unit for Teaching and Quality have also been particularized.

During the lecture on external quality assurance system, attention was called to the importance of Quality Assurance Agency at the national level. This Agency, as stated, is responsible for regular external control of quality assurance measures applied at all higher education institutions in Great Britain. Moreover, professor singled out the role of regular inspection of teacher education, as well as the importance of conducting periodical evaluations of research activities.

When it comes to internal evaluation of both teachers and subjects, students evaluate a subject and teachers without stating explicit names of teachers/teaching assistants. Special attention is placed on data protection of both teachers and students.

During a lecture on Quality assurance strategies and procedures, the course atendees were informed that these are designed to:

- offer a student with adequate academic experience,
- ensure the quality and standards of rewarding and lecture classes,
- encourage and enhance quality and stimulate the development of the curricula by demanding from its staff to, through mutual evaluation, grade each subject and program that they teach, and
- meet the requirements of external agencies in relation to standard harmonization and enhancement of learning possibilities.

Implementation of Quality Assurance strategies and procedures takes place through authorization of new external examiners, i.e. through approval of new study programs, grading, suspension, oversight and critical review of programs.

Special emphasis is placed on continuous teacher development and trainings. Stimulative measures, not punishments, are used to introduce changes. Teaching process is realized through:

- lecture classes, practice classes, lab classes and additional classes, workshops and seminars;
- third year courses and discussion classes with teaching staff;
- fourth year courses which imply a great amount of independent learning;
- final projects on the forth year.

Creativity in development of teaching material is of great importance, as that is one of the ways to achieve student engagement. Each student has his/her own mentor who follows student's progress. Mentor – student meetings are obligatory 4 times in the winter and 3 times in the summer term.

Instead of conclusion, Milan Antonijević, PhD, described the phases and programs that courses must go through in order to be approved. He also pointed out the necessity of continuous monitoring of courses and programs and their periodical revision.

## 3. TOURISM IN PRACTICE

During the study visit to University of Greenwich at Medway, i.e. Faculty of Engineering and Science, Chatham, the participants had an opportunity to visit Greenwich, London, Canterbery and Rochester, and their numerous cultural and historical sights.

A) In **Greenwich**, we made a visit to the complex, library and official premises of University of Greenwich (rectorate). Afterwards we had the pleasure of visiting the famous observatory with the prime meridian. We then went to Maritime museum, saw the Royal Naval College, etc.

Here, we were introduced to Rochester Cathedral, the base of the Diocese of Rochester who founded The King's School, considered to be the second oldest continuously running school in the world. We also had a chance to admire the Rochester Castle.
